



VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

January 6, 2012

The following summary contains various incidents of general interest as well as vehicular crashes handled by the Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department from December 30, 2011 – January 5, 2012. Readers are reminded that an “arrest” is based upon probable cause and does not always mean that someone was physically taken into custody. Furthermore, it does not mean that an individual is automatically guilty of a crime. Judicial outcomes and post- arrest proceedings can be researched through the appropriate court’s website.

INCIDENTS

Bad Checks 12-00218
Lofty Salon
354 Maple Avenue, West
December 26 9:00 a.m.

A business owner reported that a customer had written bad checks to her salon.

Once the issuer was contacted the salon owner was told that the checks were written in an attempt to overdraw her ex- boyfriend’s account.

This case is still being investigated.

Vandalism to a Vehicle 11-20508

100 Block James Drive, SW

Between December 29 at 6:00 p.m. and December 30 at 7:30 a.m.

A citizen reported that during the listed times unknown subjects scratched his vehicle. The scratch ran the entire length of the vehicle.

Destruction of Property 11-20524

Between December 29 at 6:00 p.m. and December 30 at 8:30 a.m.

Officer Tremont responded for the report of several mailbox vandalisms.

His investigation revealed that during the listed hours 3 mailboxes at separate addresses had been damaged by unknown subjects.

Animal Case 11-20506

December 30 6:55 a.m.

Officer Tremont responded to assist a Fairfax County Code Compliance Officer with the investigation of a hoarding case involving multiple animals at a residence.

The compliance officer had obtained a search warrant for the residence and a search of the home was completed.

No violations of law were observed. There are several animals residing at the home but they are all in good health.

Arrests- 2 counts each- Disorderly Conduct, Drunk in Public 11-20547

800 Block Maple Avenue, NE

December 31 2:10 a.m.

While Officer Tracy was assisting another officer with a vehicle stop, a taxi cab pulled up and stopped. As Officer Tracy approached the cab one of the two female occupants exited and began walking away. Soon thereafter the other occupant exited and began yelling at the first.

Further investigation revealed that the two women had been consuming alcohol at a restaurant in Arlington, Virginia. When they left, one of the women drove the other's vehicle as she was intoxicated. While driving, the vehicle got a flat tire. This resulted in a physical and verbal altercation between the two.

The women then decided to take a cab and resumed the altercation inside the cab.

During Officer Tracy's investigation both women continued to be disorderly and were subsequently arrested. 21 year old Sima Sari Dajani of East Street in Vienna and 21 year old Zeynab Jamal Abdulgadir of Briarcliff Court in Vienna were both arrested for Disorderly Conduct and Drunk in Public. They were then transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

Arrest- Drunk in Public 11-20566

Neighbor's Restaurant

262 Cedar Lane, SE

December 31 10:30 p.m.

Officers were called to investigate a disorderly person inside the restaurant. Upon their arrival they found 2 Fairfax County police officers with a subject outside the restaurant.

Further investigation revealed that the subject had been acting disorderly throughout the night, was intoxicated, and had been escorted out of the restaurant on several occasions. He kept returning and disrupting patrons and eventually the police were called.

Officer Tracy eventually arrested Adrian Marquez, 39, of Cedar Lane in Vienna for Drunk in Public. He was then transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

An employee reported that an elderly male was in the store and acting strangely.

Officer Tracy interviewed the man and learned where he lived. He was then transported to his home just outside of the Town and released to the care of his wife.

Arrest- Destruction of Property 12-00007

January 1 1:40 a.m.

A citizen reported that a neighbor broke a pane of glass out of his front door. The neighbor was attempting to gain entrance to the home that was hosting a party. After the glass broke, the neighbor left the area. Through investigation Officer Tracy was able to identify the neighbor.

Additional investigation revealed that the neighbor had gone to the home in an attempt to have them turn down the music at the party. While the neighbor was banging on the window it broke.

The complainant elected to prosecute the neighbor in lieu of having her pay for the damage. Pamela Sue Logan, 55, of Country Club Drive in Vienna was issued a summons for Destruction of Property and released upon her signature.

A citizen reported that she was attending a party when the host's ex- boyfriend arrived. The ex-boyfriend began being disruptive and assaulted the complainant.

The assailant left the area prior to police arrival. The warrant obtainment process was explained to the complainant.
