



VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

January 27, 2012

The following summary contains various incidents of general interest as well as vehicular crashes handled by the Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department from January 20, 2012 – January 26, 2012. Readers are reminded that an “arrest” is based upon probable cause and does not always mean that someone was physically taken into custody. Furthermore, it does not mean that an individual is automatically guilty of a crime. Judicial outcomes and post- arrest proceedings can be researched through the appropriate court’s website.

INCIDENTS

Civil Matter 12-01265

300 Block Lawyers Road, NW

Between November 2011 and January 25, 2012

A citizen reported that a creditor had taken money from one of her accounts without her permission.

Further investigation revealed that the complainant had received treatment at an urgent care type facility. The urgent care had billed the complainant on 3 separate occasions but had not received payment. The urgent care then debited the funds as part of a legal agreement made with the complainant prior to treatment.

The complainant was advised of the results of the investigation and she will follow up with the business.

ACO Barker received information from the Fairfax County Animal Shelter regarding a dog that had been taken into custody by a citizen and that had possible neglect issues.

ACO Barker investigated and learned that the dog was found running at large and taken in by a citizen. The dog was thin and appeared dirty with several hygiene issues.

He took custody of the dog and transported it to the shelter after attempts to contact its owner were fruitless.

This case is still being investigated.

An employee reported that a subject had stolen 2 cases of beer.

After an investigation Officer Lyons was able to determine the identity of the juvenile subject. Contact was made with the individual's father and both he and his son reported to Vienna Police Headquarters to meet with Officer Lyons.

Upon contacting the initial complainant he declined to prosecute the boy for the theft and simply wanted restitution. Restitution was made and the boy was released to the custody of his father.

MPO Shaver responded for a domestic assault in progress. Upon his arrival he found that a wife and her husband had become engaged in an argument. The verbal argument turned physical and the wife was struck.

A daughter returned home and discovered that her mother had passed away while she was at work.

There did not appear to be any signs of foul play. A detective will follow up on this case.

Officer Kiley responded for a hit and run crash that had just occurred. After a brief investigation he broadcasted a lookout for the violator vehicle and Sergeant Farhan located it. The Sergeant then conducted a traffic stop.

Officer Kiley responded to Sergeant Farhan's location and he soon detected signs of possible impairment.

After attempting to complete several field sobriety tests the driver, 42 year old Frederico R. Delasobera of Strawberry Lane in Falls Church, Virginia was arrested for Driving While Intoxicated and Hit and Run.

Mr. Delasobera was then transported to Vienna Police Headquarters for analysis of his breath. Subsequent to the analysis he was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and held on \$1000.00 bond.

After the analysis he was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.
