



VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

The man was transported to the Vienna Police Station where he was given the opportunity to provide a sample of his breath for analysis. After the analysis he was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was charged with Driving While Intoxicated and held on a \$2,000.00 bond.

Results of the 10th National Drug Take Back Initiative

On September 26, 2015, the Town of Vienna Police Department in conjunction with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration, (D.E.A.), participated in the 10th National Drug Take Back Initiative. As a result of that initiative the Town of Vienna Police Department collected and safely disposed of 284 pounds of expired or no longer needed medications from area citizens. The September initiative collected approximately 27,292 pounds of medications statewide. The Vienna Police Department plans to continue its participation with the United States D.E.A. for future initiatives.
