



## **VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS**

**February 12, 2016**

Readers are reminded that an “arrest” is based upon probable cause and does not always mean that someone was physically taken into custody. ### **INCIDENTS**

**Fraud 16-001053**

**500 Block Macarthur Avenue, NE**

**Between January 26 at 12:00 p.m. and February 08 at 12:00 p.m.**

A resident reported her personal identification had been compromised through a data breach with Anthem Insurance. She stated since that time there had been two occasions when someone attempted to open a Capital One credit card in her name. Both attempts were unsuccessful.

This case is being investigated.

Sgt. Farhan was on patrol when he observed the driver of a vehicle commit a traffic offense. As a result of that offense he conducted a traffic stop. Upon his interaction with the driver he detected the signs of impairment. After failing to complete a series of field sobriety tests he arrested the 33 year old man from Alloway Lane in Beltsville, Maryland for Driving While Intoxicated.

He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was given the opportunity to provide a sample of his breath for analysis. After the analysis he was charged with Driving While Intoxicated and remanded to the custody of the Fairfax County Sheriff's Office.

A resident reported he and his step-father had become involved in a heated argument after the step-son read some disparaging texts his step-father sent his mother.
