



VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

April 15, 2016

The following summary contains various incidents of general interest as well as vehicular crashes handled by the Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department from April 8, 2016 – April 14, 2016. Readers are reminded that an “arrest” is based upon probable cause and does not always mean that someone was physically taken into custody. Vienna Police Department to Participate in 11th D.E.A. Prescription Drug Take Back Initiative

Saturday, April 30, 2016 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

In conjunction with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (D.E.A.) and state and local law enforcement agencies, the Vienna Police Department will again participate in a one-day initiative to remove potentially dangerous controlled substances from area homes.

On April 30, 2016 between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. the Vienna Police Department will have a collection site for old, expired, unused, or unwanted medications. Prescription medications, controlled or non-controlled substances, and over the counter drugs may be turned in anonymously at the collection point inside the Vienna Police Department located at 215 Center Street, South, Vienna, Virginia 22180.

Participants may dispose of medication in its original container or by removing it and disposing of it directly in to the collection box. If an original container is used the individual should consider removing any identifying information from the prescription label.

Liquid products should remain sealed in their original container to prevent leakage.

Intravenous solutions, injectables, and syringes will not be accepted due to associated hazards.

Commercial businesses, pharmacies or other medical facilities may not use this as a means to discard expired medications or medical waste.

Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department 2015 Annual Report

The Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department is pleased to present its end of the year statistical summary and annual report for 2015. This comprehensive report encompasses not only criminal incidents and offenses but calls for service, enforcement activities, and crash statistics.

Colonel James A. Morris continued to be aided by a command staff consisting of three Lieutenants and a supervisory staff consisting of six Sergeants. The department's authorized staffing of 41 sworn police officers remained the same. In 2015, the department implemented the Volunteers in Police Services (VIPS) program. This program is staffed by three volunteers; Ms. Cynthia Latimer, Ms. Rachel Rohr and Mr. Zachary Smith. Their contributions to the department are an invaluable asset to the department and appreciated by the entire staff. Two additional officers, Officers Ara Post and Gregory Hylinski, graduated in August from the 64th session of the Fairfax County Criminal Justice Academy.

The Vienna Police Department experienced other changes in staffing as Lt. David Pelto retired after more than 30 years of service, MPO Michael Oliver retired after 35 years of service and the Administrative Assistant to the Chief of Police, Ms Beverly Simmons, retired after 27 years of dedicated service to the department.

Vienna officers continued their work in conjunction with the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA) to identify and arrest suspected drunk drivers. Those efforts along with their regular patrol duties resulted in a total of 67 DWI arrests.

After reinstating the National Drug Take Back Initiative by the Drug Enforcement Administration (D.E.A.) the Vienna Police Department collected 284 pounds of unused or expired medications.

Prevention is known to be the best way to reduce the risk of being a victim and the Vienna Police Department made presentations to many local civic groups on this topic. Theft of valuables from vehicles continued to be a significant issue. The department continues to remind citizens to ***remove all valuables and lock their vehicles while unattended.*** This simple method of prevention often deters would be thieves looking for easy targets.

The Vienna Police Department dispatched more than 12000 calls for service in 2015. Patrol and Traffic officers continued to address traffic related issues. Grants to allow officers to work overtime assignments in this area were secured from the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles. As a result of proactive traffic enforcement a total of 8058 traffic summonses were issued. This number includes 631 parking summonses issued.

Vienna Police Highlights is a valuable means of disseminating information for the agency. Typically published on Fridays, it is a summary of reportable incidents, calls for service, crashes, and other services performed by officers during a one-week span. The publication is more in depth than a simple crime summary and allows citizens to thoroughly understand the incidents and calls handled by our officers and staff. ***Vienna Police Highlights*** continued to be supplemented by periodic media releases on an as needed basis. Vienna Police Highlights and Media releases are posted on the Town's website at (www.viennava.gov).

The women's Rape Aggression Defense (R.A.D.) self-defense classes remained extremely popular and continue to grow. These interactive classes continue to be hosted in cooperation with the Navy Federal Credit Union and are held at their corporate headquarters.

The 2015 statistical analysis is also attached for review.

CITIZEN NOTES

TAX SEASON SCAM

Note to Citizens – *During this time of year, Tax Season, many residents report receiving calls from individuals claiming to be employees of the IRS. The callers claim the resident has either committed tax fraud or had improperly filed previous tax returns. The caller informs the resident to send a Western Union payment or purchase a prepaid debit card, for payment, or the resident will be arrested. This type of call is a scam. **Never send a payment unless you have verified the validity of the caller.***

Please Note: *Recently there have been reports of callers claiming to be relatives or representatives of a relative. The callers claim they have been arrested and in order to be released from jail the resident needs to wire a payment to an attorney or the jail. The payment is usually requested in the form of a prepaid debit card or through Western Union. This type of call is a scam. **Never send a payment unless you have verified the validity of the caller.***

Reminder: *Please remove all valuables from an unattended vehicle and most importantly, **lock the vehicle doors.***
