



# VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

July 29, 2016

## **INCIDENTS**

### **Vehicle Tampering 16-006168**

**200 Block Commons Driver, NW**

**Between July 17 at 8:30 p.m. and July 18 at 6:45 a.m.**

A resident found their vehicle had been rummaged through, nothing was taken. The vehicle was left unsecured.

A citizen called the Vienna Police Department saying they were going to commit suicide in the parking lot of the police department. Officers immediately began searching the parking lot and found a male subject (a resident of Falls Church) suffering from a gunshot wound. Officers requested Fairfax County Fire & EMS to assist, but the male subject was deceased upon officers finding him.

PFC Tracy met with a male subject who was experiencing domestic issues with a female subject. The male subject was provided with resources for counseling services.

Vehicle-1 was traveling northbound on Nutley Street, NW approaching the intersection of Malcolm Road and West Street, NW.
