



VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

November 4, 2016

The following summary contains various incidents of general interest as well as vehicular crashes handled by the Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department from October 28, 2016 – November 3, 2016. Readers are reminded that an “arrest” is based upon probable cause and does not always mean that someone was physically taken into custody. Furthermore, it does not mean that an individual is automatically guilty of a crime. Judicial outcomes and post-arrest proceedings can be researched through the appropriate court’s website.

INCIDENTS

Animal Case – Quarantine 16-009124

Charles Circle, SW

October 23 3:00 p.m.

A resident accidentally ran over his dog with his vehicle. The dog bit her owner on the hand as he tried to pick her up to transport her to The Hope Center for treatment.

The dog did not survive the injuries she suffered in the accident. ACO Barker transported to the dog from The Hope Center to the Fairfax County Health Department for rabies testing.

A resident reported receiving threatening email.

Arrest – Driving While Intoxicated / Refusal / Eluding Police 16-009214

Ofc. Bulti observed a driver commit a series of traffic violations and initiated a traffic stop. The driver attempted to elude the officer, before the stop was affected. Upon his interaction with the driver he detected possible signs of impairment. After failing to complete a series of field sobriety tests he arrested the 51 year old man from Vale Road in Oakton, Virginia for Driving While Intoxicated.

Ofc. Bulti transported the man to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was offered the opportunity to provide a sample of his breath for analysis, however he refused to submit to the test. The man was charged with Driving While Intoxicated, Refusal and Eluding Police. He was to be held on an unsecured bond until he was sober.
