



VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

A resident reported his daughter’s bicycle was stolen from his unlocked garage.

Sgt. Sheeran located the driver near Church Street. Upon his interaction with the driver he detected signs of possible impairment. After failing to complete a series of field sobriety tests Ofc. Hylinski arrested the 51 year old man from Mendon Lane, SW Vienna for Felony Hit & Run and Driving While Intoxicated.

CRASHES

Church Street and Mill Street, NE 16-009347

November 1 7:30 a.m.

Vehicle-1 was northbound on Mill Street at the intersection of Church Street. Driver-1 stated she waited at the stop sign while a bicyclist passed, and then she proceeded into the intersection.

Vehicle-2 was stopped at the stop sign for westbound Church Street. Driver-2 stated he did not observe the other vehicle when he proceeded into the intersection striking the right side of Vehicle-1.

Cottage Street and Locust Street, SW 16-009374

Driver-2 (a bicyclist) was travelling eastbound on Locust Street at Cottage Street. He stopped at the stop sign and waited for a truck pulling a trailer to make a left turn from the opposite direction. Driver-2 then proceeded into the intersection.

The driver of Vehicle-1 was northbound on Cottage Street. He did not see the bicyclist and proceeded into the intersection striking him.

The bicyclist was transported to an area hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Vehicle-2 was westbound on Kingsley Road at the stop sign waiting to turn left onto Nutley Street. Vehicle-1 was directly behind Vehicle-2 traveling in the same direction.

Vehicle-2 entered the intersection then came to a stop. The driver of Vehicle-1 proceeded into the intersection and rear ended Vehicle-2.

Old Courthouse Road at Westbriar Drive, NE 16-009558

A vehicle was traveling northbound on Old Courthouse Road approaching the intersection of Westbriar Drive when the driver ran off the road and into a ditch.

Vehicle-1 was westbound in the right lane of Maple Avenue with another vehicle traveling in the left lane. A deer jumped from the median in front of both vehicles. The driver of the vehicle in the left lane was able to avoid the deer, however the driver of Vehicle-1 struck the deer, killing it.

New Town of Vienna Police Officer Graduates from Academy

On October 28, 2016 Officer Rachel E. Rohr graduated from the 67th Session of the Fairfax County Criminal Justice Academy. The graduation ceremony was held at the Grace Covenant Church. Her graduation marks the culmination of a six month training session in which newly hired police recruits receive training in all aspects of police procedures. The six month basic recruit session is a non-residential training program consisting of over 920 hours of instruction. The curriculum includes, but not limited to, 320 hours of academic studies including crisis intervention, assisting individuals with mental illness, de-escalation techniques and first aid training. 94 hours of firearms training, 84 hours of emergency vehicle operation, 110 hours of physical training and 130 hours of defensive tactics training.

For the next twelve weeks Officer Rohr will be assigned a Field Training Instructor (FTI). During those twelve weeks the FTI will observe and guide Officer Rohr's performance in the areas of officer safety, traffic enforcement, interaction with citizens, report writing, investigation of vehicle crashes and many other aspects of her law enforcement duties.

Officer Rohr is working towards an associate degree, with intentions of getting a bachelor's degree. She enjoys physical fitness and exercise. Due to her local Vienna roots, she is an avid fan of Washington sports teams to include the Nationals, Capitals and Redskins.
