



## **VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS**

**December 9, 2016**

The following summary contains various incidents of general interest as well as vehicular crashes handled by the Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department from December 2, 2016 – December 8, 2016. Readers are reminded that an “arrest” is based upon probable cause and does not always mean that someone was physically taken into custody. ### **INCIDENTS**

Vehicle-2 was in the right westbound lane of Maple Avenue, stopped for the red traffic light. Vehicle-1 was directly behind Vehicle-2 in the same lane of traffic. Driver-1 failed to stop in time and struck the rear of Vehicle-2.

The driver of Vehicle-1 was issued a summons for Failure to Pay Full Time and Attention.

### **Maple Avenue at Park Street, SE 16-010278**

Vehicle-2 was northbound on Park Street, SE at the intersection of Maple Avenue. Vehicle-1 was traveling eastbound on Maple Avenue and made a wide right turn onto Park Street, striking Vehicle-2 and causing minor damage. Driver-1 had a brief conversation with Driver-2 then left the scene without providing any information.

### **Maple Avenue at Glyndon Street, SE 16-010286**

Vehicle-1 was traveling westbound on Maple Avenue approaching Glyndon Street. The driver fell asleep while driving and drifted into the oncoming traffic lanes then off the left side of the road. The vehicle went up onto the curb, and struck a light pole and two trees before coming to a stop.

The driver of Vehicle-1 was issued a summons charging Failure to Pay Full Time and Attention.

Vehicle-2 was stopped in traffic in the right lane of westbound Maple Avenue, just past the intersection of Beulah Road. Vehicle-1, a Fairfax County School Bus, was turning right from Beulah Road into the left westbound lane of Maple Avenue. As Driver-1 made the turn the bus struck the left rear corner of Vehicle-2.

Vehicle-1 (a USPS delivery truck) was parked on Council Court while the driver made a delivery. As the driver got out of the vehicle he forgot to put the truck in “park” and the vehicle slowly rolled down the hill, striking a tree and garage at a residence.

Two vehicles were traveling northbound on Follin Lane approaching Orrin Street. Vehicle-2 stopped for traffic for the red traffic light. Vehicle-1 was struck the rear of Vehicle-2.

Driver-2 was transported to an area hospital for non-life-threatening injuries.

**December 8 7:01 p.m.**

Two vehicles were traveling westbound on Maple Avenue near East Street, NE in the right lane. Vehicle-2 stopped in traffic. Vehicle-1 ran into the rear of Vehicle-2.

The driver of vehicle-1 was issued a summons charging Failure to Pay Full Time and Attention.
