



VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

October 26, 2018

The following summary contains various incidents of general interest as well as vehicular crashes handled by the Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department from October 19, 2018 – October 25, 2018. Readers are reminded that an “arrest” is based upon probable cause and does not always mean that someone was physically taken into custody. Furthermore, it does not mean that an individual is automatically guilty of a crime. Judicial outcomes and post-arrest proceedings can be researched through the appropriate court’s website.

Suspicious Event 18-008502

CRASHES

Follin Lane and Echols Street, SE 18-008593

October 19 2:29 p.m.

Vehicle #1 was traveling Eastbound on Echols Street, SE. Vehicle #2 was traveling Northbound on Follin Ln, SE. Vehicle #2 was entering the intersection of Follin Lane, SE and Echols Street SE with a green light. Vehicle #1 was entering the intersection of Echols Street SE and Follin Lane SE with a red light. Vehicle #2 struck Vehicle #1 on the passenger side. Driver #2 advised Driver #1 did not slow down at the red light.

Driver #1 was issued a summons for disregarding a red signal/ traffic light.

Vehicle 1 & 2 were traveling westbound on the 400 Block of Maple Avenue East. Vehicle 1 was traveling directly behind Vehicle 2. Vehicle 2 stopped for a car in front without striking the vehicle. Vehicle 1 was not able to stop before rear-ending Vehicle 2. Driver 1 advised he was looking down prior to the crash.

Driver-1 was issued a summons charging Failure to Pay Full Time and Attention.

October 22 3:00 p.m.

Both Vehicle #1 and Vehicle #2 were in the parking lot of the Sunoco gas station. Driver #1 was backing up away from the gas pumps as driver #2 was stopped within the lot awaiting movement. Driver #1 slowly backed into vehicle #2's rear bumper. There were no injuries, only very minor damage. Driver #1 at fault - improper backing. No summons issued - private property.

Vehicle 1 was backing out of 123 Battle Street, SW. Vehicle 2 was traveling East on Battle Street, SW. Driver 1 failed to see Vehicle 2 due to vehicle blind spots and Vehicle 1 struck Vehicle 2.

Vehicle # 2 was traveling southbound on the 1000 block of Park Street, SE when Vehicle # 1 pulled out in front of Vehicle # 2 from a parking lot driveway located at 1001 Park Street, SE. Vehicle # 1 was attempting to make a left turn onto park street to travel northbound. Vehicle # 2's front bumper struck Vehicle # 1's rear driver side quarter panel and bumper.

354 Maple Avenue, West 18-008729

October 23 5:42 p.m.

Vehicle #1 was attempting to make a right turn out of the parking lot of 354 Maple Ave West onto Maple Avenue Eastbound, when Driver #1 struck Vehicle #2 who was traveling in the left lane going eastbound on Maple Avenue.

Driver 1 is at fault for this accident and was issued a citation for failure to yield prior to entering a highway.

Fairfax County Fire and Rescue engine and medic 2 responded and transported Driver 2 to Fairfax Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Maple Avenue, East and Church Street, NE 18-008743

October 24 8:22 a.m.

Vehicle #1 was traveling westbound on Maple Ave East approaching the intersection of Maple Avenue East and Park Street NE. Vehicle #1 had a red light at the intersection. Vehicle #2 had a green arrow and was attempting to make a left turn from Park Street SE onto Maple Avenue East. Vehicle #1 did not stop or slow down for the red light. Vehicle #1 struck Vehicle #2 in the front right side, then struck a bush on Town Property. Vehicle #1 proceeded to jump the curb and struck a brick wall belonging to the church.

Driver #1 was issued a summons for disregarding a red light.

Lawyers Road, NW and West Street, NW 18-008753

October 24 7:04 p.m.

Vehicle #1 was traveling West on Ayr Hill Ave NW at the intersection with Lawyers Road NW. Vehicle #1 was stopped at the stop sign and then proceeded through the intersection toward West Street NW and struck Vehicle #2 which was traveling South on Lawyers Road NW.

300 Maple Avenue, NW 18-008598

October 19 7:24 p.m.

Vehicle #1 and Vehicle #2 were traveling Westbound in the 300 Block of Maple Avenue, West. Vehicle #1 was attempting to change lanes when it sideswiped Vehicle #2, that was already occupying it.

Vienna Police Department to Participate in the D.E.A. Prescription Drug Take Back Initiative

Saturday, October 27, 2018 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

In conjunction with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (D.E.A.) and state and local law enforcement agencies, the Vienna Police Department will again participate in a one-day initiative to remove potentially dangerous controlled substances from area homes.

On October 27, 2018, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. the Vienna Police Department will have a collection site for old, expired, unused, or unwanted medications. Prescription medications, controlled or non-controlled substances, and over the counter drugs may be turned in anonymously at the collection point inside the Vienna Police Department located at 215 Center Street, South, Vienna, Virginia 22180.

Participants may dispose of medication in its original container or by removing it and disposing of it directly into the collection box. If an original container is used, the individual should consider removing any identifying information from the prescription label.

Liquid products should remain sealed in their original container to prevent leakage.

Intravenous solutions, injectables, and syringes will not be accepted due to associated hazards.

Commercial businesses, pharmacies or other medical facilities may not use this as a means to discard expired medications or medical waste.
