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# 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment

## June 13–June 20

### Abolition of Slavery

This amendment explicitly banned slavery and involuntary servitude in the United States. An exception was made for punishment of a crime. This amendment also gave Congress the power to enforce the article through legislation.

Throughout the year, Bards Alley and the Vienna250 Committee are cohosting a series of author events. This event partners with the Liberty Amendments Month Committee to celebrate Juneteenth and feature Gayle Jessup White, author of “Reclamation: Sally Hemings, Thomas Jefferson, and a Descendant’s Search for Her Family’s Lasting Legacy.”



Ms. Jessup White is a Black descendant of Thomas Jefferson and Sally Hemings and her book explores America's racial reckoning through the prism of her ancestors—both the enslaver and the enslaved. Ms. Jessup White had long heard the stories passed down from her father's family, that they were direct descendants of Thomas Jefferson. For four decades the acclaimed journalist and genealogy enthusiast researched her connection to Thomas Jefferson, to confirm its truth once and for all. After much research, she learned that not only was she a descendant of Jefferson on his father's side; she was also the great-great-great-granddaughter of Peter Hemings, Sally Hemings's brother. Today, Ms. Jessup White is Public Relations & Community Engagement Officer at the Thomas Jefferson Foundation, the non-profit organization that owns and operates Monticello. She is the first descendant of Jefferson and the families he enslaved to be employed by the Foundation.

# 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment

## June 21–June 26

### Citizenship and Equal Rights

This amendment set out the definitions and rights of citizenship in the United States. The first clause asserted that anyone born or naturalized in the United States is a citizen of the United States and of the state in which they live. It also confirmed the right to due process, life, liberty, and property. This overturned the Dred Scott v. Sandford (1857) Supreme Court ruling which formally stated that Black people were not eligible for citizenship.

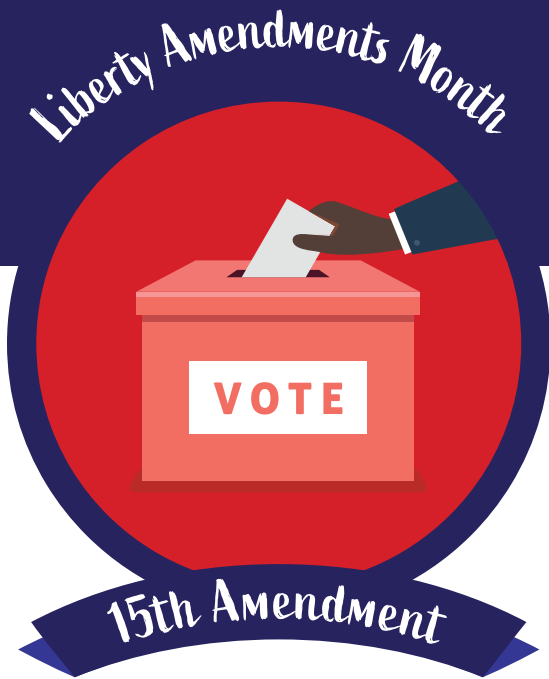

# 15<sup>th</sup> Amendment

## June 27–July 3

### Voting Rights

This amendment prohibited governments from denying U.S. citizens the right to vote based on race, color, or past servitude. While the amendment provided legal protection for voting rights based on race, other means could be used to block Black citizens from voting. These included poll taxes and literacy tests. These methods were employed around the country to undermine the Civil War Amendments and set the stage for the Civil Rights Movement.

The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Naturalization Ceremony will take place during Vienna's sixth annual Liberty Amendments Month. The event will start at 3:30 p.m. with live music and entertainment from the Vienna Community Band and other performers. The Naturalization Ceremony starts at 5 p.m.

15 candidates for naturalization, representing different countries of origin from all over the world, will take the Oath of Allegiance at the Ceremony. Remarks will be delivered by Mayor Linda J. Colbert, USCIS staff, and a special keynote address from Ron Levy who is the son of Jewish German refugees, and has been a Fairfax County resident of more than 57 years. Scout troops from Vienna will present the colors and lead the pledge of allegiance, and a member of the Vienna Youth Players *Guys and Dolls* cast will sing the national anthem. # 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment

## July 4–July 13

### Extended Women's Rights to Vote

This amendment declares that the right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex. Congress shall have the power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation. 2020 marked the 100th anniversary of this amendment.

The program will conclude with a recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

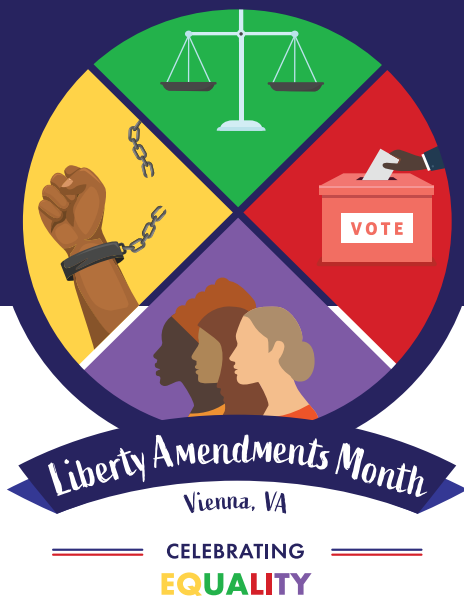

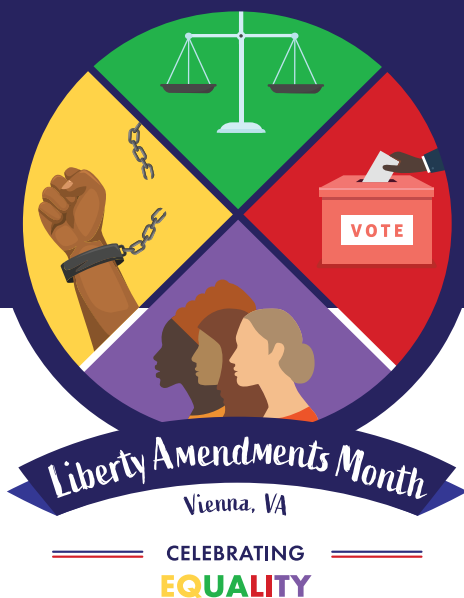

# Liberty Amendments Month

## History and Milestones

Liberty Amendments Month annually commemorates the passage of the 13th, 14th, 15th, and 19th Amendments through a series of programs and events that brings together members of the community and celebrates the diverse heritage and history of the greater Vienna Community, Commonwealth of Virginia, and United States of America.

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## History and Milestones

**June 2020** Town Manager, Mercury Payton initiates the Liberty Amendments Month concept.

**December 2020** Mayor Linda Colbert and Vienna Town Council votes to observe Liberty Amendments Month annually in June and July in Resolution #009-2020.

**January 2021** The Virginia General Assembly adopted joint Resolution #583 recognizing Liberty Amendments Month as a statewide observance.

**June 19–July 19, 2021** Town of Vienna and Liberty Amendments planning committee hosts inaugural Liberty Amendments Month which included 65 virtual and in-person events to more than 22,000 participants.

**September 2021** The Town of Vienna and Liberty Amendments Month receive Local Champion and President's Innovation Awards from the Virginia Municipal League.

**May 2022** Liberty Amendments Month wins First Place in the National Association of Government Communicators Blue Pencil, Gold Screen Awards.

**June 2022** Delegate Mark Keam, Senator Chap Petersen, and the Town of Vienna recognize Leigh Saunders Kitcher with a resolution and certificate of appreciation for outstanding leadership and dedication to Liberty Amendments Month.

**June 18–July 19, 2022** Town of Vienna and Liberty Amendments planning committee hosts second annual Liberty Amendments Month which included 35 virtual and in-person events to more than 11,000 participants.

**March 2023** Town of Vienna recognized with Historic Preservation Awards from Historic Vienna, Inc. for Liberty Amendments Month.

**September 2024** Town of Vienna Parks and Recreation and Liberty Amendments Month Committee recognized with Best New Diversity Equity and Inclusion Initiative for 'Liberty Amendments Month Naturalization Ceremony' from the Virginia Recreation and Park Society.

**October 2025** Town of Vienna Parks and Recreation and Liberty Amendments Month Committee recognized with Best New Diversity Equity and Inclusion Initiative for 'Our American Liberty Stories' program from the Virginia Recreation and Park Society.

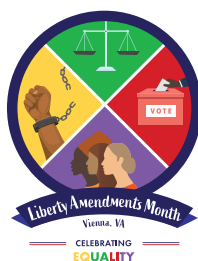
