E-Bike Community Safety



The Vienna Police Department hears the concerns from residents about unsafe and reckless e-bike riding in our neighborhoods and throughout Town. Your calls, messages, and reports do not go unnoticed. We see the dangers caused by unsafe riding, and we are taking action to help make our community safer.

Our approach combines enforcement, education, and community partnership. Officers are increasing patrols in areas where complaints are most frequently reported and during times when concerns are most common. When violations are observed, officers will enforce applicable Virginia laws and hold offenders accountable.

We are also working with community partners to identify practical solutions and strengthen safety for riders, pedestrians, and motorists. Education and prevention remain an important part of this effort. The Department will continue sharing clear information about e-bike laws, safe riding practices, and responsible ownership.

Parents and guardians play an important role. Talk with your children about safe, legal, and responsible riding. Set clear rules, know where they ride, and make sure they understand that e-bike riders must follow applicable Virginia traffic laws. The habits young riders learn now can prevent dangerous decisions later.

Community members can also help. If you see dangerous or reckless riding, report it while it is happening. Real-time reporting allows officers to respond appropriately and helps the Department identify patterns, repeat behavior, and areas of concern throughout Town.

Cities and towns across the country are facing many of the same challenges involving e-bikes and unsafe riding. Vienna is no different. With continued enforcement, education, awareness, and community involvement, we can work together toward safer and more responsible riding.

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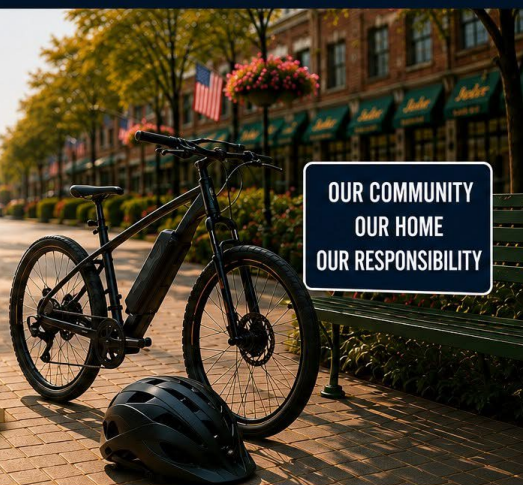
